
supervision of qualified SLPs of RLIAHS and Arif Memorial Hospital, pupils were guided on how to make accurate phonological and articulation assessments as well.





BLOOD TRANSFUSION AND HEALTHY LIFE FOR DONOR AND RECIPIENT

This activity was arranged as an important part of training for the students in 'Student Leadership Programme'. In this programme O and A level's students participated from different schools.

Blood Transfusion is an indispensable component of health care as it contributes in saving millions of lives each year. Blood Transfusion face a dual

challenge of ensuring both a sufficient supply and the quality of blood and blood products. HIV/AIDS pandemic focused the world's attention on blood transfusion as a significant route of HIV/AIDS and also other blood borne diseases like Hepatitis B and C, Malaria, Chagas disease, etc.

This camp is designed to raise awareness of these issues in students and laboratory staff. In this participants learned about Needs of blood transfusion, blood and blood products, donor selection criteria and most important the screening of blood for different infectious diseases. A brief demonstration of the whole process was given to the participants.


With the help of that kind of activities we can help our community by giving them a safe blood transfusion and lowering the ratio of blood borne diseases.

A lecture was delivered by Dr. Kalsoom Ijaz in which she highlighted the importance of History taking of a patient, visual acuity, visual acuity charts, procedure and documentation of visual acuity. Then, students were taught practically about how to record distant and near vision.



CLINICAL ROTATIONS

Rashid Latif Institute of Allied health sciences arranged one week clinical rotation for 3rd year Optometry and Orthoptics students at Jinnah hospital Lahore from 30th July, 2018 to the 3rd of August, 2018. The objective of the clinical rotation was exposure of students to the manifold patients, all diagnostic instruments and tertiary health care system under government. The rotation was conducted under supervision of one of our faculty member Ms. Fatima Zahid. Premier two days included practice of diagnostic procedures of eye like FFA, OCT, Tonometry and Perimetry. Last three days embodied with orthoptic assessment, autorefraction and subjective refraction.











It was the best illustration for the students of Optometry and Orthoptics as it allowed them to observe and diagnose various diseases. Moreover it helped a lot in experiencing the system and working methodology at a government hospital.



FREE EYE CAMP

One week free eye camp was arranged at Arif Memorial Hospital. In this camp whole department perform free eye surgeries and examination with completely free medication and lab tests.
